THERE ARE 2 SECTIONS:

ADOLESCENT: Baby Puppies;
Minor Puppies;
Puppies
Juniors

ADULT: Intermediate
Australian Bred
Open

For an exhibit to be eligible for entry all owners must be financial members of The Working Dog Club of NSW Inc and financial members of a controlling State Canine Council from the time of participation to completion of the 2010-2011 Competition. Membership of The Working Dog Club of NSW Inc may commence at any time during the Members' Point Score Competitions but only points acquired from the date when all owners of the exhibit are financial members will be included.

Awards received at Championship show level only are eligible for inclusion.

1. HOW TO ENTER:

2. DEFINITION OF A 'RARE BREED' FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE MEMBERS' POINT SCORE COMPETITION ONLY:

A 'Rare Breed' is defined by there being no breed club in evidence to support the breed *in New South Wales*. Where a Breed Club has been formed in New South Wales for only a short period and up to the commencement of these Competitions for 2010-2011 has not been granted approval to hold a Specialty Show with Championship status, such breed for the purpose of the competitions is defined also as a Rare Breed.

3. RECOGNITION OF AWARDS.

Awards from shows **conducted by clubs affiliated with Dogs NSW only** are eligible for inclusion attracting points as detailed:

a) N.S.W. All Breeds Championship Shows

Best Exhibit in Group	-	12 points
Runner-Up to Best Exhibit		11 points
Class in Group	-	8 points

b) N.S.W. All Breeds Championship Shows where Group placings are made:

Best Exhibit in Group	-	12 points
Runner-up to Best Exhibit		11 points
3rd in Group	-	10 points
4th in Group	-	9 points
Class In Group	-	8 points

c) Sydney Royal 2011

Group Level Awards only, attracting the following points:

Best Exhibit in Group	-	24 points
Runner-Up (2nd place)	-	22 points
3rd in Group	-	20 points
4th in Group	-	18 points
Puppy in Group	-	16 points

d) (i) Breed Specialty Championship Show

As the number of Championship Shows conducted by Group 5 NSW Clubs during 2010-2011 varies, in order to achieve parity awards received at *one (1)* specialty championship show only are eligible for inclusion for the following breeds:

Australian Cattle Dogs;
Australian Kelpies;
Australian Shepherds;
Australian Stumpy Tail Cattle Dogs;
Bearded Collies;
Border Collies;
German Shepherd Dogs;
Old English Sheepdogs;
Shetland Sheepdogs.

Best Exhibit in Show	-	24 points
Runner-Up in Show	-	22 points
Class in Show	-	16 points

d) (ii) Breed Specialty Championship Show where there are varieties within the breed

In order to achieve equality for the following breeds it is necessary for points to be awarded at *breed level*. As in d) (i) above, this applies to *one only* Championship show conducted by these NSW Breed Clubs.

Belgian Shepherd Dogs: *Groenendael; Laekenois; Malinois; Tervueren*
Collies: *Rough & Smooth*
Welsh Corgis; *Cardigan & Pembroke*

Best of Breed	-	24 points
Runner-up Best of Breed		22 points
Class in Breed	-	16 points

e) New South Wales Full Group Championship Shows excluding those run by The Working Dog Club of NSW Inc during the period:

All full Group championship shows will attract the following points for *any/all* of the breeds within Group 5:

Best Exhibit in Show	-	12 points
Runner-up to Best Exhibit		11 points
Class in Show	-	8 points

f) The Working Dog Club of NSW Inc Championship Shows November 2010 and May 2011 will attract double points for any exhibit entered through to "In Show"

Best Exhibit in Show	-	24 points
Runner-up to Best Exhibit		22 points
Class in Show	-	16 points

g) The Working Dog Club of NSW Inc Championship Show May 2011 - Rare breeds as defined in 2.

The following awards will attract the points as detailed for *rare* breeds only within Group 5.

Best Exhibit in Show	-	36 points
Runner-Up to Best Exhibit		33 points
Class in Show	-	24 points

This allows for equality with breed club supported breeds being able to attract double points for ONE specialty per year.

N.b. The points detailed in 3. are the maximum points achievable from any championship shows.

4. MULTIPLE ENTRY OF AN EXHIBIT:

Where an exhibit from the Adolescent Section of the Competitions has been entered in a Championship Show in an Adult category, points for any award received at that show will be applied as though that exhibit were entered in the Members' Adult Point Score Competition. Such awards from that show will not contribute to points in the Adolescent Section.

5. PROCEDURE FOR SUBMITTING RESULTS:

With the exception of both Championship Shows run by The Working Dog Club of NSW Inc during the 2010-2011 Competitions, and Sydney Royal 2010, all other results should be forwarded to the Members' Point Score Secretary, and include the following information ONLY:

- *Name of Exhibit
- *Name of Owners
- *Date of Show
- *Body conducting the show
- *Award received

At no stage during the competitions will results be accepted by telephone; nor will they be accepted if handed to members of The Executive, or Committee Members of The Working Dog Club of NSW Inc.

Final Results must be submitted *via email* no later than September 15, 2011; by *snail mail* the envelope must carry a postmark no later than September 15, 2011.

6. THE FINAL TALLIES

Should a situation arise where, in the final tally, the total points in either section of two or more exhibits are equal, and the levels of awards equal, then they will be recognised as joint winners.

7. CONFIRMATION OF RESULTS

The Working Dog Club of NSW Inc reserves the right to confirm results submitted either with those printed in the Dogs NSW Journal, or with the appropriate Show Secretary.

8. ADVICE TO WINNERS AND PLACE GETTERS

Members participating in the Competitions will receive a final status report either by email or snail mail soon after the closing dates for awards received – *i.e.* September 15 2011. A copy of the final status report will be printed in the September/October 2011 issue of **WDC NEWS**.

9. PRESENTATION OF TROPHIES TO WINNERS

Presentation of trophies to the winners and/or joint winners of both sections will take place during the luncheon break at the November 2011 Championship Show conducted by The Working Dog Club of NSW Inc.
